essays in self portraiture is the first book length study devoted entirely to comparing the written self portrait of montaigne with the painted self portraits of another artist rembrandt the author begins by examining the nature of self portraiture which he defines in relationship to biography autobiography and portraiture thereafter he examines the origin and nature of self portraiture as a toponymical phenomenon by pairing specific self portraits the author compares rembrandt and montaigne in terms of courtiership and in terms of religious wisdom and ignorance the book closes by showing how both artists used dissimilarity in their self portraits by selectively embracing and rejecting certain exemplars montaigne and rembrandt constructed two of our most complete examples of the early modern self

defined as a self image made with a hand held mobile device and shared via social media platforms the selfie has facilitated self imaging becoming a ubiquitous part of globally networked contemporary life beyond this selfies have facilitated a diversity of image making practices and enabled otherwise representationally marginalized constituencies to insert self representations into visual culture in the western european and north american art historical context self portraiture has been somewhat rigidly albeit obliquely defined and selfies have facilitated a shift regarding who literally holds the power to self image like self portraits not all selfies are inherently aesthetically or conceptually rigorous or avant guard but as this project aims to do address via a variety of interdisciplinary approaches selfies have irreversibly impacted visual culture contemporary art and portraiture in particular selfies propose new modes of self imaging forward emerging aesthetics and challenge established methods they prove that as scholars and image makers it is necessary to adapt and innovate in order to contend with the most current form of self representation to date the essays gathered herein will reveal that in our current moment it is necessary and advantageous to consider the merits and interventions of selfies and self portraiture in an expanded field of self representations we invite authors to take interdisciplinary global perspectives to investigate various sub genres

aesthetic practices and lineages in which selfies intervene to enrich the discourse on self representation in the expanded field today

this book demonstrates how artists have radically revisited the genre of the self portrait by using a range of technologies and media that mark different phases in what can be described as a history of self or selves production gabriella giannachi shows how artists constructed their presence subjectivity and personhood by using a range of technologies and media including mirrors photography sculpture video virtual reality and social media to produce an increasingly fluid multiple and social representation of their self this interdisciplinary book draws from art history performance studies visual culture new media theory philosophy computer science and neuroscience to offer a radical new reading of the genre

abstract self portraits are my obsession the repetition of reproducing my face over and over again constantly challenges my ego and self ideology it is a challenge for me to be truthful with my own image sparking my fascination with our societal standards of beauty and the need to manipulate our faces to appease it i attempt to confront these issues by taking on a weird uncomfortable and intimidating approach to my image my work consists of digital photographs extremely close up to my face and tall tightly cropped acrylic paintings sectioning and responding to these photographs my face is my focus as i choose to manipulate and change my look through makeup hair and lighting highlighting my features and expressions an attraction to the unattractive causes me to create an uncomfortable image for the painting which then becomes beautiful through the presentation of a delicate texture made with soft makeup like marks of paint tapped on with a stencil brush contemporary self portraiture plays a part in these images as they are realistic and larger than life while suggesting female beauty issues i hope to use these self portraits as a self constructed therapy to overcome my issues with beauty and as a way of dealing with my rheumatoid arthritis my vision for this thesis and exhibition is to demonstrate my obsession with my face and my issues with beauty related to this obsession
